

❖ **Examination Regulations: LL.B. (3- Year) Degree Course** (w.e.f. 2010-11)

- The examination for the degree of LL.B. shall consist of six semesters in three years. A student passing all the six semester examinations and successfully completing total 12 weeks of Internship as prescribed shall be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Law i.e. LL.B. degree.
- No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the LL.B. semester examinations unless he/she has the required percentage of attendance in classes as per rules of the University.
- Each year of the LL.B. (Three Year) Degree Course shall consist of two semesters. Examinations for each semester shall be held at the end of that semester. The scheme of examination shall be announced by the University.

1. Promotion from Odd to Even Semesters:

Any student who has appeared in the examinations for the LL.B. I, III or V Semester (which may be termed as Odd Semesters) shall be *automatically* promoted to the next semester namely, to the LL.B. II, IV or VI Semester (which may be termed as Even Semesters) respectively, subject to other provisions of this Ordinance.

2. Minimum Pass Marks:

- (i) A student who has appeared in the LL.B.II Semester Exams shall be declared 'pass' when he/she has secured *minimum 36% marks in each of the total 10 papers of the LL.B. I and II Semester examinations and has secured minimum 45% aggregate marks in total* jointly in both semesters.
- (ii) A student who has appeared in the LL.B. II Semester exams shall be "Fail *but Eligible for promotion to the LL.B.III Semester*" when he/she has secured minimum 36% marks each in at least 8(eight) out of total 10 (ten) prescribed papers of the LL.B. I and II Semesters.
- (iii) A student who has appeared in the LL.B. IV Semester exam shall be declared "pass" when he/she has secured a minimum of 36% marks in each of the total 10 (ten) papers *including two practical papers* of LL.B. III and IV Semesters and a minimum 45% aggregate marks in total jointly in LL.B. III and IV Semesters.
- (iv) A student who has appeared in the LL.B. IV Semester exams shall be "Fail *but Eligible for promotion to the LL.B. V Semester*" when in the result for the LL.B. III and IV Semesters, he/she has secured minimum 36% marks each in at least 8(eight) papers *including both the practical papers* out of total 10 (ten) papers prescribed therein.
- (v) A student who has appeared in the LL.B. VI Semester exams shall be declared "pass" if he/she has secured minimum 36% in each of the *total 26 (twenty six) theory and 4 (four) practical papers* of LL.B. I Semester to LL.B. VI Semester and a *minimum aggregate of 45% in each of the three years* of the LL.B. (Three Years) degree course.

3. Where any candidate fails to secure at least 36% marks in minimum 3 (three) papers in LL.B. I or LL.B. II semester, minimum 2 (two) theory papers in LL.B. III or LL.B. IV semester, or at least 2(two) theory papers in LL.B. V or LL.B. VI Semester or any of the practical papers in any semester, such candidate shall have to repeat that whole semester i.e. shall have to reappear in all prescribed papers of that particular semester in which he/she has failed in passing such minimum number of papers/practical paper.

4. Internship:

All students shall be required to successfully complete each term of Internship with any organization/NGO/body/office etc. (*refer to Curricula for the detailed list*) recognized in writing for the purpose by the Dean, Faculty of Law/ Head, Department of Law/ Principal, Law College concerned. Each student shall keep an Internship Diary in the form stipulated by the Faculty/ College concerned, the last page of which shall contain a blank format of the Performance Report to be filled/ issued by the competent officer/ authority of such organization/NGO/body/office etc. in regard to performance of the student (Intern) during Internship. This Diary, along with such performance report, shall be evaluated internally by the teacher(s) concerned each time. Where the evaluation result is "satisfactory", it shall be regarded as successful completion of that term of internship. An evaluation of student's performance report of his/ her Internship shall be made at the end of each concerned semester, but total marks for Internship shall be assessed only in the Final Semester under the prescribed Practical Paper.

Any student who remains absent or fails to successfully complete the Internship prescribed for any Semester-end shall have to repeat the same, subject to the condition that no internship at any semester-end shall jointly or severally exceed the duration of 30 days.

Notwithstanding anything contained in other provisions of this Ordinance, any student who is unable to successfully complete Internship of total 12 weeks during the LL.B. (three year) course as prescribed by the Bar Council of India shall NOT be awarded the degree of LL.B. by the University.

5. Reappearing: Subject to limitations imposed by other provisions of this Ordinance, any candidate who fails to secure minimum 36% marks in any **theory** paper of any semester, shall be entitled to reappear in that individual paper with the regular examination of the concerned semester in future.

In the entire duration of the LL.B. (Three Year) course, the maximum number of chances available to any candidate for reappearing in any paper, in which he/she has failed, shall not exceed two in any case.

Provided that where any student passes all the individual papers of both semesters of a year, but fails to secure an aggregate of 48% in total in that year, then he/she shall be entitled to reappear *in maximum two of those theory papers* of his/her choice with the regular examination of the concerned semester in future. However, such choice of paper(s) can be made only once, and the maximum chances for *reappearing* in such paper(s) shall not exceed *two* in any case.

7. Scrutiny: There shall be no re-evaluation or re-checking in any paper in any case. However, a student may apply for scrutiny in the prescribed form, as per the existing general rules of the University in this regard. Mere application to the University for scrutiny in any subject shall not confer any special claim, eligibility or entitlement to such applicant in any regard.

❖ **Formal Dress Code during Internship and Moot Court:** Students placed under internship or in moot court exercise shall have formal dress of *legal professional in pupillage* as follows:

- For All: White/Black trouser, White shirt, Black tie, Black coat, Black shoe and Black socks.
- Optional for Girl Students: White Kamij/ Kurta, White Salwar, White/ Black Chunari, Black coat; Or Black printed saree, with White blouse and black footwear.
